During this year of intense activity (2013) we have been working through the same complex economic scenario inherited from 2012. Despite this situation, we have increased our efforts to strengthen our Chair's International presence and collaborative networks worldwide, with a particular focus on African partners. We have consolidated our formal functioning structure thanks to our University and the support received to fund an assistantship this year of 2013; we have improved our Chair's website; we have worked on our contacts with African universities, we have actively participated in International Congresses, we have contributed to Orbicom Annual General Meeting and we have also organized special academic seminars in our institution. Nevertheless, a lot of work is still to be done. We are just beginning to build up a network between our own Unesco Chairs in Spain and we are in our way to achieve collaborative projects between our own Chair and African institutions. In 2013 we will work on these aspects and also we will still continue to organize academic meetings and to publish materials in national and international journals as a way to establish ourselves as a reference in Communication and African Studies.

IV. Outcomes.

2013 has been an intense and complex year for our Chair's work. We have successfully held our First Permanent Seminar on Communication and Africa with two special guest speakers: Dr. Mr. Fackson Banda, from UNESCO, París, France and Mrs. Lola Huete Machado, from El País, Spain. In the same context, we had a session dedicated on Journalism Education, with the participation of several experts from different universities in Spain. In a related topic, we also were involved in the organization of a Seminar on "The reputation of journalists".

We continue our active contribution to meetings of UNESCO chair holders in Communication and to other Orbicom activities. During this year our Chair has also established networks with research institutions, for instance, the International Research Institute IMDEA Networks at Universidad Carlos III de Madrid and particularly with their NETCOM Research Group on Networks and Communication Technologies. We are willing to collaborate with them in an ongoing project on Internet Mapping in Western Africa.

We have also strengthened our ties with two academic journals leading research in Communication and Africa such as Ecquid Novi: African Journalism Studiesm and the Journal of African Media Studies.

Our Chair staff has contributed to several publications but a special mention should be made on our Monographic issue "New (?) African Communication Environment". Index.Comunicación, Vol 3, Nº 2. URJC-AFRICOM. This includes 11 articles covering a wide range of topics on Africa and Communication.

During this initial period, we have tried to consolidate the Chair basic structure of functioning, together with a new strategy of action that will connect all Spanish Unesco Chairs in Communication in order to collaborate in joint projects.

V. Forthcoming activities

On 29 and 30 April, 2014 the UNESCO Chair in Communication Research and Africa (AFRICOM) will be involved in the organization and development of the International Congress: Africa con \tilde{N} , led by the African Women's Foundation which will take place at Felix Houphouet Boigny University, Côte d'Ivoire.

The President of Felix Houphouet Boigny University, Ms. Dr. Ramata Bakayoko -Ly, together with the President of the African Women's Foundation, Ms. María Teresa Fernández de la Vega and the Prime Minister of Côte d'Ivoire, Mr Daniel Kablan Duncan will inaugurate the International Congress which will bring together more than fifty specialists in Hispanic literature and culture, predominantly from Africa, who will present their research and projects.

Ms. Carmen Caffarel Serra, director of the AFRICOM Chair, will open the inaugural lecture with a presentation on the value of Spanish in the world.

Also, a new congress presentation will be made: Sendín, José Carlos; Caffarel Serra, Carmen: Media and Democratic Consolidation in Africa. Côte D'ivoire Transition Through The Media. In the Congress "Communication and Social Change in Africa 3: ICT, Creative and Cultural Industries, Social Appropriation and Cultural Diversity", co-organized by the universities of Grenoble (France) and Douala (Cameroon) on 10-11-12th April, 2014. This presentation has served as a base for an article to be published in « Les Enjeux de l'information et de la Communication », in editorial process at the moment.

At the second semester of 2014 or maybe in 2015 a Permanent Seminar on Human Rights in the African Context will be held.

By late 2014 a Second Special issue focusing on Spanish Heritage Research in África is expected in Index, our Department's academic journal.
